# STUDY PURPOSE



- Document GCTD's annual contribution to the local economy (based on FY 17-18 data)
- Inform the public how essential investing in transit is to the local economy
- Study findings provide support for transit funding discussions

## DIRECT EFFECTS



**Direct Effects** - jobs and wages for GCTD's own workers

## **Operations & Maintenance**

- Annual (Fixed-route) operational expenses: payroll \$15 million; \$22 million in transit services, employing 200+ staff;
- Annual operational expenses for MV
   Transportation (ACCESS) are over \$3.5 million employing approximately 44 personnel.

## Capital

Supports 73 jobs from among construction firms and construction related jobs.







## INDIRECT EFFECTS



**Indirect Effects** - purchases from vendors who supply equipment, materials, and services, thus supporting jobs and wages at vendor companies.





#### **Operations & Maintenance**

- Supports 72 jobs across various sectors;
   annual labor income of \$3 million
- Payments to over 250 vendors amounted to \$2,911,317 in FY 17-18

#### Capital

 Supports 21 jobs across various sectors; annual labor income of \$1.4 million; Local indirect transactions represent \$4.5 million in local sales



## INDUCED EFFECTS



**Induced Effects** - the re-spending of worker wages on consumer purchases, which support additional jobs and wages in retail and service sectors of the economy.

#### **Operations & Maintenance and Capital**


- 127 local jobs are associated with increase in local household spending;
  - \$6 million in wages and benefits;
  - \$19 million in sales



### **JOBS BY SECTOR & OCCUPATION**




Jobs by Sector, Operations & Maintenance (FY17-18)

### **JOBS BY OCCUPATION & SECTOR**





# SUMMARY OF FINDINGS



- Over 494 jobs are supported by the Districts FY 17-18 budget
- Jobs generated represent nearly \$31 million in worker income
- \$67 million in total output in goods and services in the region
- 23 different occupations across 14 Sectors
  - Educational services, health care and social assistance industry workers relying most heavily on transit
  - Approximately 20% of workers who use transit are employed in these sectors across most cities
