





Fixed Route Trends

- Overall, ridership increased by 1.7% year over year.
- 4th Quarter ridership decreased 1% year over year.
- Ridership gains occurred in the 1st and 2nd
 quarters, with small ridership losses in the 3rd and
 4th quarters.
- Routes 17, 18, & 23 annual ridership increased.
- Routes 7, 15, 16 & 19 annual ridership declined.
- Systemwide productivity increased from 19.1 passengers per hour to 19.7
- Ontime Performance improved to 84.4% this year from 82.8% last year.

Annualized (24-25) Ridership Service Evaluation




Local Route

Goal: 20 passengers/hour


Monthly Ridership







BOARDINGS BY PAYMENT TYPE









Mobility Trainer Passes

- Program in place since 2018
- 245 mobility passes issued in FY25
- One-on-one and small group training
- Class sizes range from 7–24 students
- 75+ training hours per classroom each month & about 9+ hours per person
- Trainers provide feedback on routes, sidewalks, and stops


